Message from the President

Prairie State Legal Services, together with the Central District of Illinois Chapter of the Federal Bar Association and the United States District Court for the Central District of Illinois, presents "Helping Survivors of Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Seek Justice." This will be a free CLE program and lunch on **August 28, 2019, at 12:00-1:30 p.m.** at the federal courthouse in Peoria, located at 100 N.E. Monroe Street, to learn more about how to help survivors of domestic violence and sexual abuse seek justice.

On September 4, 2018, President Trump signed the "Pro Bono Work to Empower and Represent Act of 2018," also known as the "Power Act." Under the Power Act, the Chief Judge in each judicial district must lead at least one public event with a state or local domestic service provider promoting pro bono legal services as a critical way in which to empower, and assist, survivors of domestic violence.
